

FRENCH AVIATOR MAURICE GUILLAUX VISITED AUSTRALIA
FROM APRIL TO OCTOBER 1914.

DURING HIS 200 DAYS IN AUSTRALIA HE MADE MANY
PIONEERING FLIGHTS INCLUDING THE CARRIAGE OF
THE FIRST AIR MAIL AND AIR FREIGHT
FROM MELBOURNE TO SYDNEY, JULY 1914.

ON SATURDAY 2 AND SATURDAY 9 MAY 1914
HE GAVE MAJOR DISPLAYS OF AEROBATIC FLYING
BASED ON VICTORIA PARK RACECOURSE WHICH
FORMED PART OF THE CURRENT RE-EDVELOPMENT
OF THE ZETLAND AREA. THESE DISPLAYS WERE
ATTENDED BY UP TO 60,000 PEOPLE.
